Dear Apostles,

Saturday, Feb. 12th was an important day in the life of Holy Apostles. Our entire community was invited and more than 50 members came together for a day of strategic visioning and planning. Last fall our parish leadership decided that this was something that we as a community need to do and that early 2017 would be the right timing.

For us, this was a spiritual day of prayer and discernment. We aren't a secular organization—like the Rotary or Kiwanis Club (which are great organizations, by the way!). We are a faith based, Christ centered community—so we approached this in a spiritual way: Who is God calling us to be? What is God calling us to do?

God's people have always had a vision. At the end of Matthew's Gospel, Jesus gave his Apostles a Mission! Jesus said, "Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit" (Matt. 28:19). With these words he sent them out for worldwide mission.

For us, our mission starts in our own backyard, in our own neighborhood. We are called to reach people for Jesus, share God's love and grace with people who need it.

Though we haven't done visioning and planning in the last 5 years; Holy Apostles has always been a church with a vision. Seventeen years ago, when the plans for our current building were drawn up, our current building was Phase 1. Those Apostles also drew up Phase 2 (Education Building) and Phase 3 (large Sanctuary) building plans. They looked down the road, casting a vision to the future. We pulled those out and used those original drawings when we started Lighting the Way in 2015. I mention this—building plans from years ago and LTW to say that Holy Apostles has always been a people with a vision. If we look back in our history, this is something we've done before, it's part of our DNA.

As a community, I think we are primed and ready for this. After our growth the last four years, the timing is right. Also, as you might know, home construction is planned to resume in Trace Crossings in April. Over the next several years, 1500 acres will be developed and hundreds of homes will be built. We will have several thousand people moving into our neighborhood. How will we respond to our new neighbors? How do we want to approach the growth in our neighborhood?

What happened on February 12th was an exciting, important and really fun day! We've started the conversation and this will be an ongoing process. Please pray for our parish as we discern our future together. Invite God to continue to use us in this part of Hoover. I am excited about our future and anxious to see where God will lead us!

Dear People of God: The first Christians observed with great devotion the days of our Lord's passion and resurrection, and it became the custom of the Church to prepare for them by a season of penitence and fasting. This season of Lent provided a time in which converts to the faith were prepared for Holy Baptism. It was also a time when those who, because of notorious sins, had been separated from the body of the faithful were reconciled by penitence and forgiveness, and restored to the fellowship of the Church. Thereby, the whole congregation was put in mind of the message of pardon and absolution set forth in the Gospel of our Savior, and of the need which all Christians continually have to renew their repentance and faith.

I invite you, therefore, in the name of the Church, to the observance of a holy Lent, by self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on God's holy Word. Bidding Prayer to Lent (BCP 264-65)

I am going to make a suggestion to you this Lent that may at first sound a bit odd. This Lent I want you to think about yourself, and not so much about others. I know for some of you that may sound a bit heretical, but let me explain. Jesus said we are to love God with all of our heart and mind and soul, and from that commandment flows the second commandment to love our neighbors as ourselves. I wonder if sometimes we get so busy running around helping others that we ignore or forget to think about our own relationship with our Father and our own need for a Savior. And I also wonder if we forget that all our good works flow from that relationship with God.

The season of Lent is perhaps one of the oldest traditions of Christianity, and it dates back to the 2nd or 3rd Century. During Lent, we are preparing our hearts for Easter, and so we are invited/reminded by the church to think about our own need for pardon and absolution. We are invited to renew our repentance and faith. The bidding prayer that we say on Ash Wednesday sets out this theme for the season. I therefore invite you to think about yourself (heart, mind and soul), and I invite you to do so through the spiritual disciplines set forth above.

As to prayer and reading Scripture, you may want to consider taking on a daily discipline beyond what you may already doing. One good option is Morning Prayer (BCP 75) or Evening Prayer (BCP 115), both of which are easily accessible online at www.missionstclare.com. Or you could do the good old-fashioned route of reading Scripture from your own Bible according to the Daily Office. We are in "Year One" and the list for Ash Wednesday and the Lenten readings begins at BCP 950. Additionally, in the BCP 136, you will find the Daily Devotions for Individuals and Family. Or perhaps you and your family may want to say Compline together each night (BCP 127). There are lots of options available!

As to fasting, you may of course want to give something up. Another option is to fast on Ash Wednesday, on Fridays, and/or on Good Friday. Finally, some of you may want to go even deeper in your personal examination. Our prayer book contains a rite for individuals that you may want to consider, The Reconciliation of a Penitent (BCP 446-452).

Annual Meeting Report

Holy Apostles' Annual Meeting 2016 was held in October with a good turnout. Fr. Blake thanked retiring Vestry members Jan Mize, Mary Parish, and Michael Woolley. A slate of nominees was accepted for three-year terms including Emily Bennett, Lisa Bridgman, and Jamie Strong. Tommy Lotz's term was extended by one year.

Jason Whatley, new Senior Warden, announced that HA has once again won a Hoover Beautification Award. He noted that the maintenance of our Church home for the past year, in addition to the cleaning service and lawn maintenance, included repainting, cleaning, organizing storage for a building that is "used daily." He said these efforts "speak volumes of our growth." He addressed the long process of the church survey stating, "We couldn't have done it without Fr. Blake; he listened with head and heart." He expressed thanks to our Diocese for Reverend Robin Hinkle's presence and the new programs she has initiated. He also reminded us that we are blessed with Deacon Marti Holmes, who is also the Archdeacon of the Diocese.

Dorothy White reviewed details of our financial status. Mary Parish said of fundraising efforts, "We need to figure out what works and find something the entire parish can support."



A new Web site of our own is under construction and the Vestry thanks the parish for reducing the mortgage that has freed up other monies for ministries. The Annual Response Committee noted that 94 individuals and households have made a pledge which enables HA to plan its budget. The Annual Meeting 'hard copy' includes reports from ministries and both Junior and Senior Wardens; a Treasurer's report; and the Rector's report. (Copies are available if you missed this important meeting!)

Fr. Blake closed his report with optimism for the new year. "It's exciting to think about where God might lead Holy Apostles and what God is calling our community to do. Start praying now about where God is calling us in 2017."

Property Update



2016 was a great year for Holy Apostles, including the building and grounds of the church. While I cannot take credit for most of the improvements and clean up, Jason and several dedicated volunteers tackled many projects in 2016...some more conspicuous than others. Some of these projects included:

- Painting the nave and narthex
- Adding handicap parking spaces to better serve the needs of our congregation and to bring HA into full compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act
- Organizing the storage area behind the altar
- Programming the thermostats to run more efficiently and cost effectively
- Shredding old files and purchasing equipment to make all classrooms multi-use rooms
- Winning the 2016-2017 Hoover Beautification Award

What a fantastic congregation and space Holy Apostles is blessed to have! 2017 promises to be another great year, but I need your help. If you notice any problems or have ideas for improvements, please send me an email at jrwarden@holyapostleshooover.org. Because the church is used 5-6 days per week from 8AM until 8-9PM many eyes pass through our doors, but not everyone sees the beauty surrounding it. Strategic Visioning for Our Little Church on a Hill

Saturday, February 11, was an awesome day for Holy Apostles! Leslie Manning with Ministry Architects came to our parish that day and led a Strategic Visioning and Planning session for us. We had a great turnout with over 50 parishioners taking part in the day. We talked about our values as a parish, our gifts and blessings, our challenges, and our 5-year goals. And we talked about what makes Holy Apostles so special and why we all love this place so much.

For our values as a parish we listed some pretty incredible things that I think we can all agree on: inclusiveness, welcoming, spiritual, faith in action, compassion, gospel-centered, acceptance, fruit of the spirit, service. Every time that I walk through that door, those are some of the things that I feel.

For our strengths as a parish and as a church family we listed things like community, willing servants, theology, inclusive & loving, deep hearted, strength in diversity, welcoming, generous, and spirit of family. What a blessing!! What a blessing that we all have to be a part of a community like this!!

Let's be honest, I think we all agree that these values and strengths describe this community, our church family, pretty well!!!

But as great and wonderful as all of that is, we all know and we all recognize that we have our challenges as a parish as well. We all know that the size of our mortgage is a big concern and it is a valid concern and one that we are continuing to address through our Lighting The Way efforts. Did y'all realize that since we started Lighting The Way a little over 2 years ago that we have nearly \$300,000 committed to that effort and have paid down our mortgage by over \$175,000?? Friends, that's amazing and speaks volumes about our values and our gifts and our blessings here at Holy Apostles. But it's not just the size of our mortgage that is a challenge, it's also the size of our physical space—or lack thereof. Last weekend we also identified that there is potential for burnout of our volunteers which is something that also needs to be addressed.

These are all real challenges that we have to meet head on. I told our Vestry at our February Vestry meeting and I'm telling everyone here in this letter the same thing—friends we've got a lot of work to do. These are not simple tasks and this is going to take some effort on everyone's part. But the beautiful thing about all of this is that we have an incredible support system here with our Holy Apostles' family. With the help and guidance of everyone along with our partnership with Ministry Architects we will pave the way, set the course and light the path for Holy Apostles' future.

At our Strategic Visioning day we also talked about goal-setting in the 4 areas: children and youth, hospitality & evangelism, mission & service, and inreach/ways we care for one another. There were some great ideas presented for all of those areas of focus. In the coming weeks, with the help of Leslie Manning, we will continue to do more work in the area of goal setting. Your Vestry and clergy will be working with Ministry Architects to make sure that our goals are measurable and on point for this season of ministry here at Holy Apostles and that we are answering the call of where God is leading us as a parish. We are incredibly excited that we will have the opportunity to share more about that part of our visioning day with everyone very soon.

We have always acted with a sense of mission and a sense of purpose here at Holy Apostles. That drive and that faithful vision has led us to where we are today and I am confident that it will continue to lead us and guide us into our future.

Friends, I think we would all agree that we are a church that has always practiced inclusiveness and hospitality. Guess what? We've got company coming over! The town is growing around us. Opportunity abounds. The question that we have to ask ourselves is how will we welcome them?

This year, the Convention-goers explored Evangelism and what that means to individuals, our parishes, and the world. Racial Reconciliation is the topic for 2018, and 2019 will focus on the Stewardship of Creation.

This was a Wild Hair project brought together by Kenn and me with our Vestry’s support.

The weather was perfect—unseasonably warm with a light breeze. Pop-up tents kept most of the leaves out of our Fry Pots, too. How many people know the difference between a Bay Leaf and a Holy Apostle Oak leaf?

Our Customers said they enjoyed our Cajun Fried Turkeys and Every Chef liked hearing that! To date, no one has ever gotten sick from an Apostles with Fire cooking project, but Poultry is a problematic food item.

We made a few dollars financially and had a great time in working fellowship. And, we learned a lot. Kenn and Bill are reviewing cost factors and opportunities at scaling up; adjusting our recipe; and working out logistics for finding 12-lb. turkeys, thawing, and maintaining proper food safety standards.
